Civil War

Charles Fowler served in the Thirty-third Regiment, US Colored Infantry of the US Army during the Civil War. Born in Saint Augustine, Florida, he likely was a runaway slave before his military service. Afterwards, he worked as a laborer in Saint Augustine. Fowler died in 1917 and is buried in the Saint Augustine National Cemetery.
