

Samuel Osburn Jr.
c. 1842-1915
Civil War

Samuel Osburn Jr. served in the Thirty-third US Colored Infantry of the US Army during the Civil War. He served with his father in this unit. Born in Florida, he lived as a freedman, working as a waiter in Saint Augustine, Florida, prior to his military service. Few details exist of his life after the war. Osburn died in 1915 and is buried in the Saint Augustine National Cemetery.
