Second Seminole War

- 1835-1842
- When the US Government tried to force the Seminole Tribe to give up their land in Florida and move west of the Mississippi River.

Civil War

- 1861-1865
- When the southern states succeeded (left the United States) to form their own country because they wanted states to be able to decide if they could have slavery or not.

Spanish-American War

- 1898
- Conflict between the United States and Spain that ended Spanish colonies in America and resulted in the US gaining territories in the western Pacific and Latin America.

Philippine-American War

- 1899-1902
- One of the territories that the US gained from the Treaty that ended the Spanish-American War, was the Philippines. Rather than become a territory of the US, there were many Filipino Nationalists who wanted to become independent instead.
- This resulted in a long and bloody conflict.

World War I

- 1914-1918
- The war pitted the Central Powers—mainly Germany, Austria-Hungary, and Turkey—against the Allies—mainly France, Great Britain, Russia, Italy, Japan, and the United States.
- The majority of the fighting was in Europe

World War II

- 1939-1945
- Fought between the Axis Powers (Germany, Italy & Japan) and the Allies (France, Great Britain & the United States)
- Most fighting was in Europe, although the attack on the Pearl Harbor in the US is what ultimately forced the US to officially join the war

Korean War

- 1950-1953
- Conflict between North Korea, (a dictatorship) and South Korea (a democracy) in which the US aided the South Koreans

Vietnam War

- 1954-1975
- Conflict between communist North Vietnam, and democratic South Vietnam, aided by the United States
