- **Army**-the primary ground force (Active/Reserve/National Guard)
- Navy-the primary provider of naval force(Active/Reserve)
- **Air Force**-the primary provider of Air Power (Active/Reserve/National Guard)
- US Marines-ground and amphibious force (Active/Reserve)
- **Coast Guard**-rescue, and police the high seas and in wartime an auxiliary to the Navy (Active /Reserve)


