"Just across the street from Dexter's is another one of the few remaining bastions of the old neighborhood. Alonzo Roberts and James Chandler run a barbershop at the corner of New England and Pennsylvania. Through their wraparound, picture windows, they see it all, looking out onto Shady Park on one side of the street, Dexter's on the other.

The men have been partners for more than 40 years, all of it spent cutting hair in Hannibal Square. They've seen the Big C come and go. They've battled with Bellows, who offended them by suggesting a shoeshine stand be placed outside their door, a remark they took as a racial slur. Their shop is decorated with a picture of Martin Luther King, a poster of Allen Iverson and a depiction of the last supper in which Jesus Christ and all the apostles are black.

Neither one of them has plans to walk across the street for lunch at Dexter's anytime soon.

"Not my cup of tea," says Chandler, who filed an unsuccessful lawsuit charging that the city and Bellows were in a conspiracy to drive blacks out of Hannibal Square, "Not my poison."

Roberts puts the finishing touches on a young man's fade. He looks out the picture window and tries to think of something positive to say.

"The way it is now, it looks nice," he concedes. "But it's not Hannibal Square anymore."

At the first Hentage Day in January residents brought yellowing photographs that depict the neighborhood as it once was — an all-black mix of poor and working-class families

"People have family portraits from 1930s and '40s, pictures of kids walking through unpayed streets." Schrever said

Historians interviewed residents about the photographs and made copies of them. Two more Heritage Day events are planned before organizers compile the photographs and iral histories into an exhibit to be shown at the community or neter.

At Rullins College, a group of faculty and students are working on their own ways to help preserve the west side.

Some Rollins faculty were so angry with the way the city handled the renovation of Shady Park, when game tables favored by some residents were removed as a nuisance that they are boycotting whiteowned west-side businesses that advocated tearing out the tables. The battle over Shady Park crystallized the battle for the soul of the city's historically black neighborhood. It has sparked an intense debate and soul-searching on what kind of community Winter Park will be an increasingly affluent, homogenous city of the wealthy or a mixed, heterogeneous community with room for everyone

"The problem is when the real estate becomes so expensive folks can't live there anymore "said Bruce Stephenson, a professor of environmental studies at Rollins College who specializes in urban planning

"For folks [who] have been living there for years, the value of homes and taxes go up so much, it becomes difficult for them to stay," he said "Part of the problem is success of Winter Park and failure of the region — there are so few places that are well-designed and don't have gates on them."

Other neighborhoods of

Winter Park face the same pressures. In Stephenson's neighborhood off Lakemont Avenue and others across Winter Park, small houses are bulldozed to make room for mansions

"It's a Catch-22." Stephenson said "Every town wants real estate to appreciate in value, but here that appreciation in value is destroying neighborhoods. It's a difficult problem across the city, and it's obviously worse on the west side."

For Roberts, who has cut hair on Hannibal Square for six decades that market is both friend and foe. He is glad to see the neighborhood improve, but it commercial rents get too high, he won't be able to keep his shop open. If residential rents get too high, he'll lose most of his customers.

"I'm a black barber." he said "I cut black hair. If there are no black heads in this community. I'm through."

"Stay too long in a spot along Park Avenue in Winter Park, and Melinese Roberts would be there to issue a parking citation.

A longtime fixture on the city's iconic street, Roberts, a parking-enforcement officer who patrolled the downtown area in a three-wheeled vehicle, spent 40 years with the Police Department.

"She loved that job," said her daughter, Mexcye Roberts of Winter Park. "She did it with a smile."

Roberts, of Winter Park, died Aug. 23 of complications from ovarian cancer. She was 79. Born in Georgia, Roberts grew up in Winter Park, attending Winter Park Elementary and later Hungerford High School in Eatonville. After graduating, Roberts enrolled in a beauty school, where she was a talented student, said her husband, Alonzo Roberts, 89.

She would "teach when the teacher was absent," he said..."


