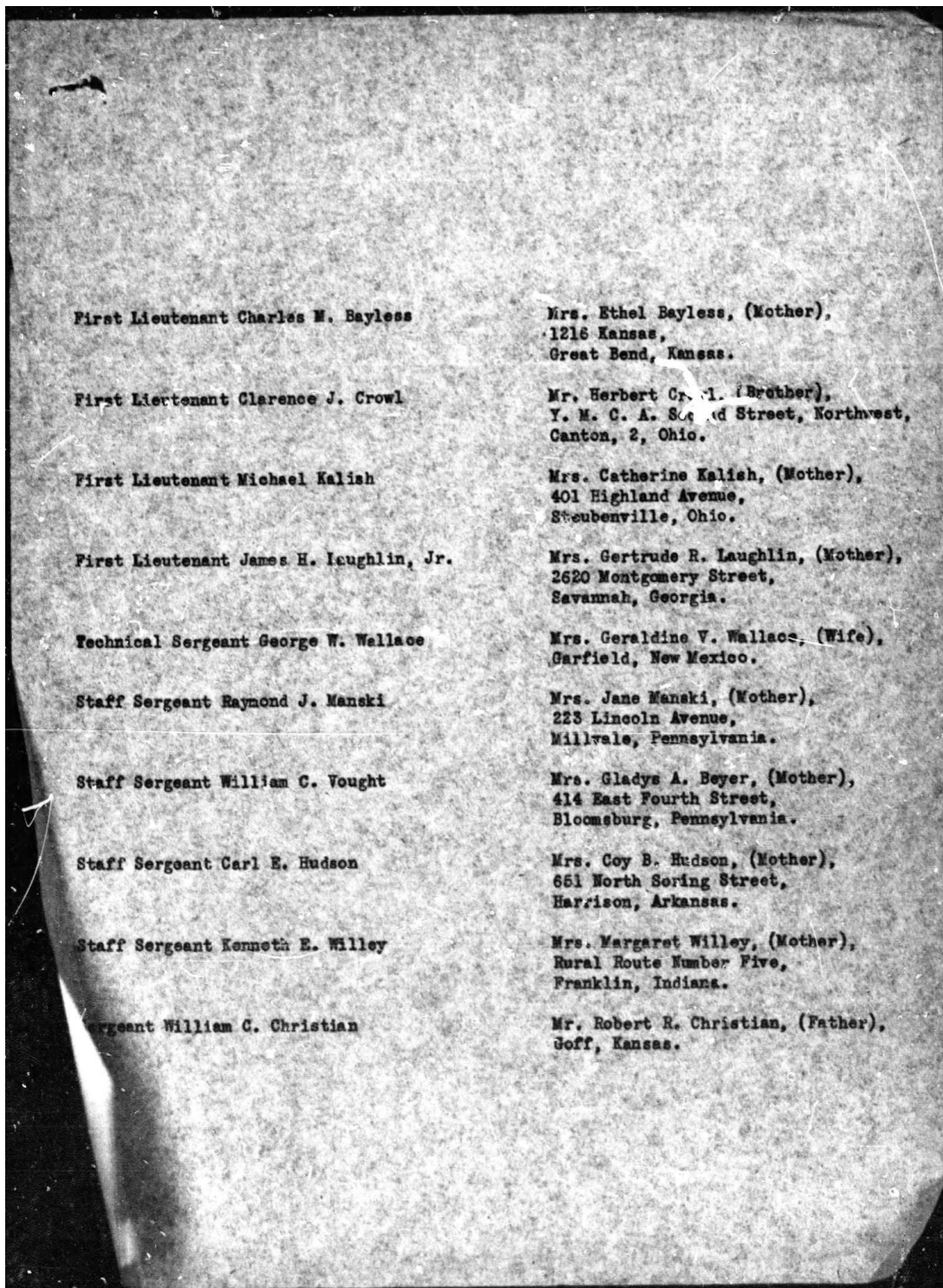

This information may be pertinent.

Lts. Bayless, Crowl, and Laughlin along with T/sqt. George Wallace, the engineer, had their pictures taken on the steps of the city hall of the town near which we were shot down. The burgomeister of the town spoke perfect English and mentioned the fact that the picture was going to be printed in the local newspaper. I was unable to get the name of the town. The first German town I was able to recognize was Wissembourg on the border of Germany and Alsace. We reached Wissembourg after about one hour's drive in a slow-moving charcoal-burning lorry. We then moved to an airfield on the outskirts of Haguenau. That is all I can say. Perhaps the picture was printed in the newspaper.

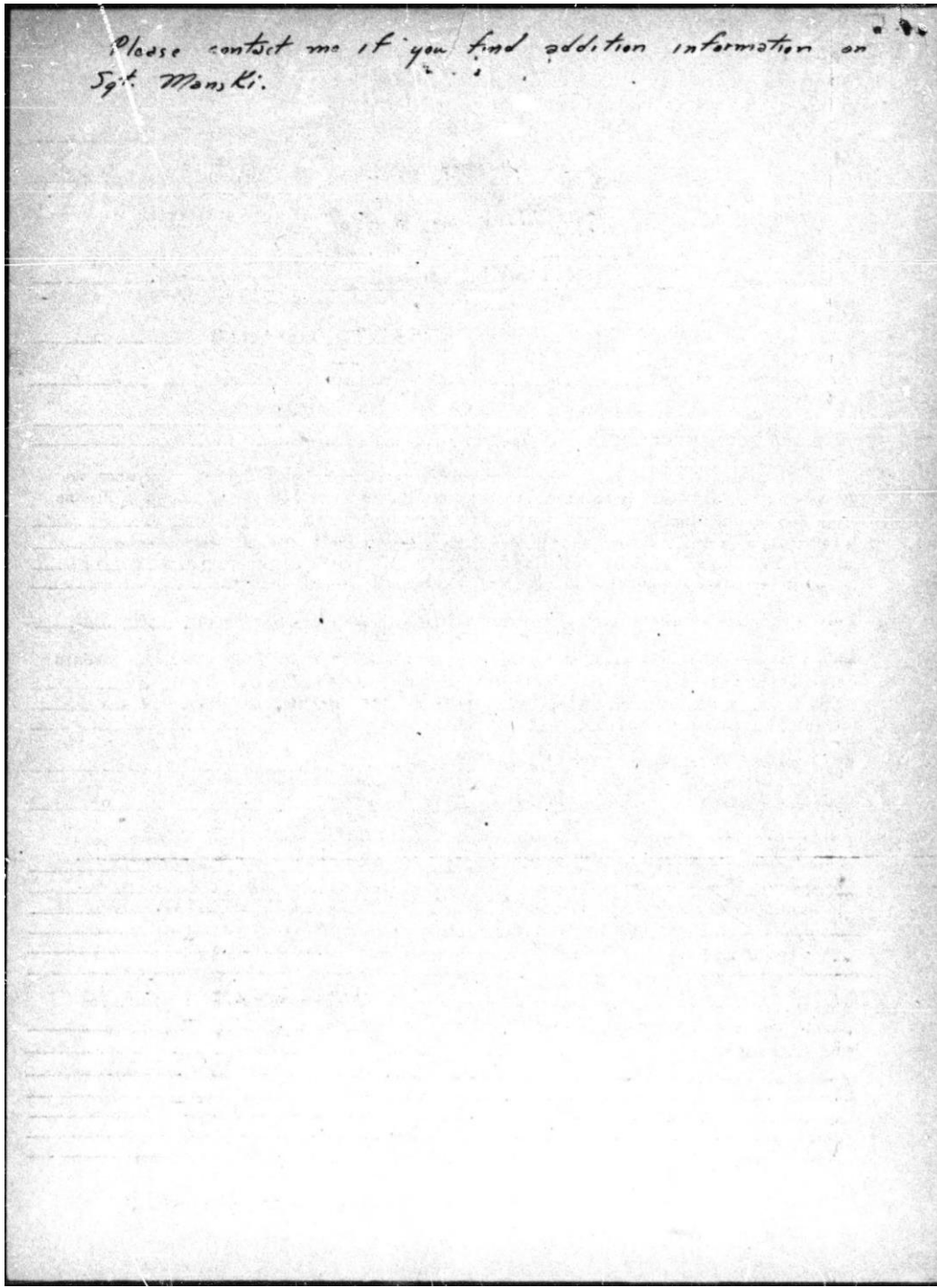

Clarence J. Crowl, 423rd, and Trygve Olsen, 369th, were both copilots who "enjoyed" lengthy stays in a German prison camp, and renewed experiences at the 306th Restaurant.
