



Abbett, 19 formerly of Annapolis, was wounded in South Vietnam recently, where he had served for three months, it was learned from a Department of Defense communique. Abbett, son of Mrs. Bernard R. King, of 268 Hilltop La., suffered from a shrapnel in the elbow when an enemy hand grenade exploded, the letter said. The young soldier, who entered the service last March, is serving with the 199th Infantry."

The article states, "The Combat Infantryman Badge, mark of distinction for the fighting soldier, was awarded to PFC Gerard F. Abbett in Vietnam. Pvt. Abbett, son of Mrs. Dorothea L. Abbett, is assigned to Company B, 2nd Battalion of the 199th Infantry Brigade's 3rd Infantry as a machine gunner. CIBS have been awarded since late in World War II for sustained contact against an enemy in ground action. The badge is a blue rectangle with a silver rifle mounted on it and a curved wreath at the top. Subsequent awards are represented by stars... in the center of the wreath. Pvt. Abbett's father, Theodore H. Abbett, lives at 151 Walden St., Cambridge, Mass."

The men in the clinic are not damaged young warriors just back from Afghanistan and Iraq. They are graying. They are balding and bespectacled. And like Abbett, 59, they have only recently begun to deal with the psychological wounds they sustained in Vietnam."



The article cites his time in Vietnam, saying, "After graduation he volunteered to join the US Army. He was sent to Vietnam, where he became his Captain's radio chief and right hand man. Sergeant Gerard F. Abbett served with B Company, 2nd Battalion, 3rd Infantry, 199th (Separate) (Light) Brigade (Old Guard) in the Mekong Delta, Republic of South Vietnam from August 1967-August 1968. Sergeant Abbett was combat wounded in October 1967 & in July 1968 and received two Purple Hearts." It also discusses his activism after the war as a Veterans' advocate.
