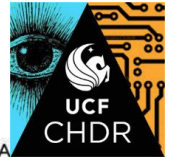

YOU ARE HEREBY AUTHORIZED, WITHIN ONE YEAR OF THE DATE HEREOF, TO CELEBRATE THE PROPOSED MARRIAGE AT ANY PLACE WITHIN THE COUNTY OF NEW HANOVER. POPE, TAYLOR FINISH TALKS

F. D. R. Envoy Presumably Outlined to Pontiff U. S. Peace Aims

VATICAN CITY, Sept. 16.—(AP)—Pope Pius, XII, talked for an hour today with Myron C. Taylor in a private audience which completed the mysterious special mission for which President Roosevelt's envoy came by air a week ago. Presumably, the pontiff told Taylor of his views on the war and peace aims of the United States and Great Britain, which Taylor will convey to the President.

It also was assumed the Pope gave some indication of his attitude toward maintenance of the Soviet regime in Russia, which Rome always considered the arch-foe of religion, through American and British aid against Germany. However, Vatican sources said, the Pope's attitude toward the belligerents would remain, publicly at least, one of strict neutrality.

Peace moves appeared out of the question in these talks, Taylor unofficially was understood to have reiterated to the Pope the President's intention to help Great Britain crush Hitlerism. Observers considered it likely Taylor told the Pope the President considered the Nazi menace to the world and to the welfare of its people greater than that of Communism.

The Pope is to receive Taylor and his wife in a farewell audience Friday before the envoy's departure for New York Monday, but today's audience was understood to be the last one of diplomatic significance.

Wallace Foresees Fall Of Nazi 'House Of Sand'

NEW YORK, Sept. 16.—(AP)—Vice-President Wallace said tonight that while the American people were "tremendously interested in peace," they would "hate to see this war end prematurely in a way which would insure a third and more horrible war in our generation."

In an address prepared for the Fordham university centenary celebration, the vice-president called for a world organization to establish a "new order built on justice, charity and peace."

"The Hitler house is built upon the sands and the winds are blowing," he said. "I predict that behind the walls where lie France and Poland, Belgium and Luxembourg, Holland and Norway, Yugoslavia and Greece, the winds are blowing at the foundations of Hitler's house. Force untimpered by justice brings the tornado to the house of force, itself."

"No one can predict the day of the fall of the house of Hitler. But all men of keen perception know that this house will fall from within through the faisty of the architect—through the refusal of Hitler,

himself, to believe that the human being and his rightful needs are the bricks and mortar of any permanent house of God and government on this earth."


