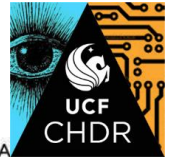

Attn: Service Command Quartermaster.

1. Reference to 8th indorsement, my letter dated 8 May 1944, subject, burial sections, you are advised that further communication on this matter has not been received here.

2. 13 July 1944, a telegram was received from the Quartermaster General, which authorized interment in the Post Section, the remains of the wife of Brigadier General, Edward M. McCook. This seemed to indicate that either Section A, or Section B, which originally constituted the Post Cemetery, St. Francis Barracks, was still considered a Post Section. As there were no grave sites available in Section A, the remains of Mrs. McCook, were interred in Grave No. 653, Section B.

3. At 6/20 PM 23 October 1944, a telegram was received from the Medical Officer in Command, U. S. Naval Hospital, Jacksonville, Florida, notifying arrival for burial at 1500 24 October 1944, remains of Sub. Lieut. Montague Statman, Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve. The telegram also stated that British Representatives requested interment be made alongside the grave of Sub. Lieut. Ernest Mark Cecil Maples and other British Students buried here. The burial was made in Grave No. 3, Section C, Lieut. Maples having been buried in Grave No. 2.

4. There are no grave sites available in either Section A, or Section B, as all that are not in use are either reserved or obstructed. It is therefore recommended that the first row of graves in Section C, graves Nos. 1, to 18, be reserved as a Post Section. Section D, is a Colored Section.
