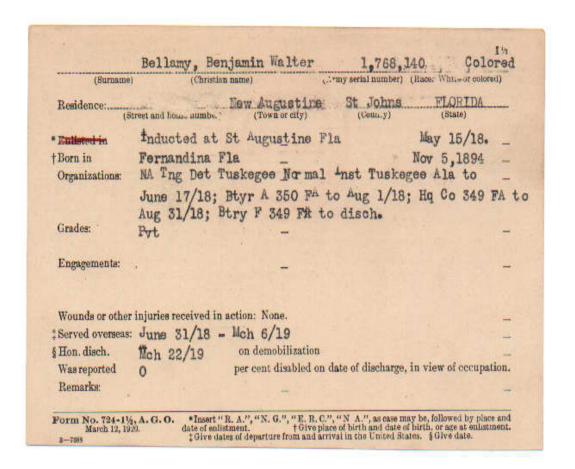
## Benjamin Bellamy 1894-1944 World War I

Benjamin Bellamy served in the 349<sup>th</sup> Field Artillery of the Ninety-second Division of the US Army during World War I. Born in Fernandina, Florida, Bellamy worked as a farmer prior to his military service. Bellamy died in 1944 and is buried in the Saint Augustine National Cemetery.





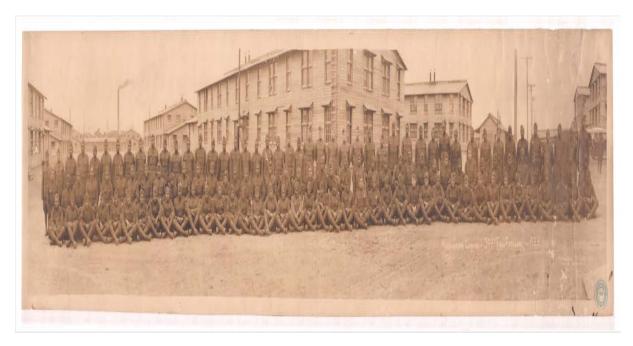
