Benjamin Bellamy served in the 349th Field Artillery of the Ninety-second Division of the US Army during World War I. Born in Fernandina, Florida, Bellamy worked as a farmer prior to his military service. Bellamy died in 1944 and is buried in the Saint Augustine National Cemetery.

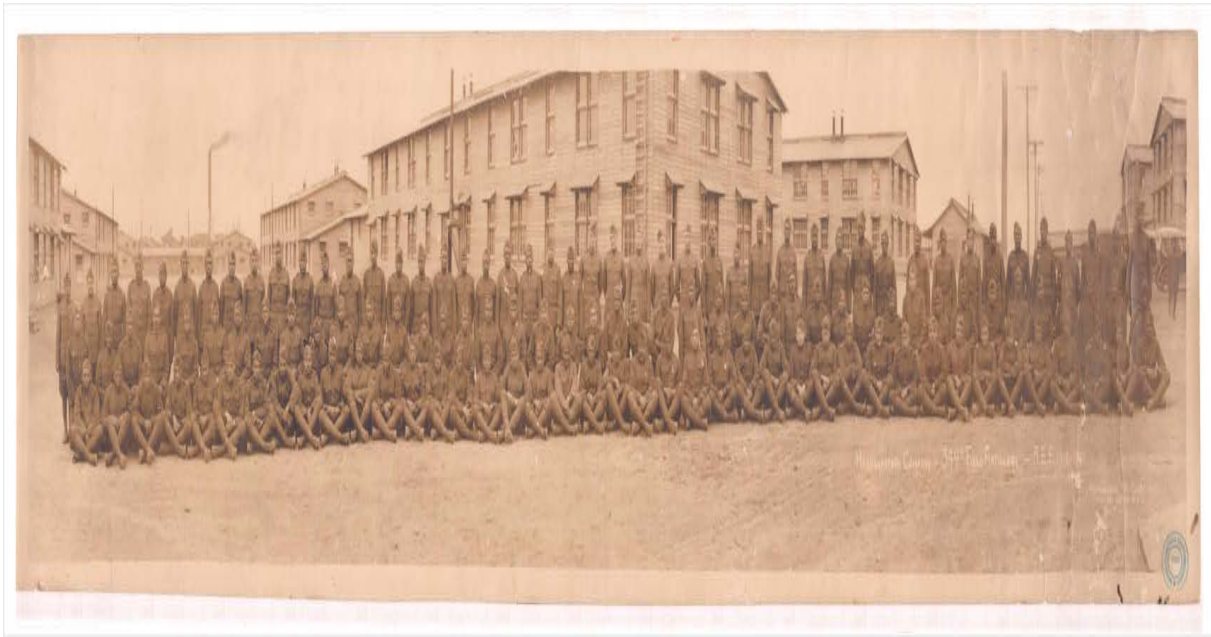
