Jim Davis served in the 519th Engineer and later the Fifteenth Engineer Service Battalions of the US Army during World War I. Born in Bainbridge, Georgia, Davis worked as a turpentine laborer prior to his military service. Davis died in 1943 and is buried in the Saint Augustine National Cemetery.
