James Green served in the 438<sup>th</sup> Reserve Labor Battalion of the US Army during the World War I. Born in Atlanta, Georgia, he worked as a driver prior to his military service. His postwar life is unknown. Green died in 1942 and is buried in the Saint Augustine National Cemetery.
