## **1891-1943**

### **World War I**

Henry Jenkins served in the Receiving Company Forty at Camp Johnston as part of the US Army during World War I. Born in Madison, Florida, Jenkins worked as a laborer prior to his military service. Jenkins died in 1943 and is buried in the Saint Augustine National Cemetery.
