Joe King served in the 153rd Depot Brigade of the US Army during World War I. Born in Albany, Georgia, King worked as a laborer prior to his military service. Afterwards, he continued to work as a laborer in Jacksonville, Florida. King died in 1942 and is buried in the Saint Augustine National Cemetery.
