Henry Manley served in the 548th Engineer Service Battalion of the US Army during World War I. Born in Jacksonville or Tallahassee, Florida, Manley worked as a laborer in a sawmill in Climax, Georgia. Manley died in 1940 and is buried in the Saint Augustine National Cemetery.
