## Edward Parker 1886-1941 World War I

Edward Parker served in the Depot Service Company 29 Army Service Corps of the US Army during World War I. Born in Saint Joseph, Louisiana, Parker moved to Buffalo, New York, where he worked as a cook in the railroad industry prior to his military service. Afterwards, he continued to work as a cook. Parker died in 1941 and is buried in the Saint Augustine National Cemetery.





"Edward Parker." *USS Liberator*. Image of ship Parker and his unit sailed from France to the US.




