(1897-1946)
World War I**

Charles Sims served as a Private in the Auxiliary Remount Depot No. 333 during World War I. He lived in Arcadia, Florida, prior to his military service. His post war life is unknown. Sims died in 1946 and is buried in the Saint Augustine National Cemetery.

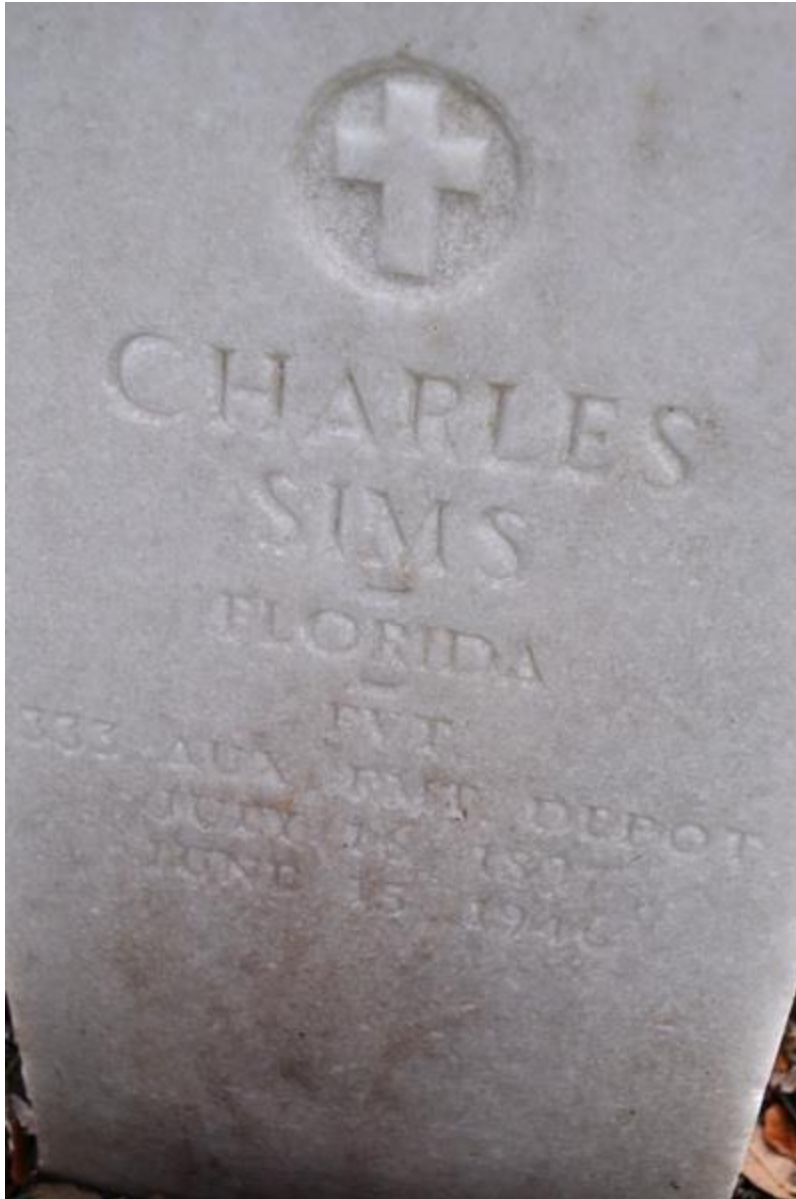
