1891-1941
World War I**

Jim Spencer served in the 153rd Depot Brigade of the US Army during World War I. Born in Union Springs, Alabama, Spencer worked as a laborer in the turpentine industry prior to his military service. Spencer died in 1941 and is buried in the Saint Augustine National Cemetery.
