
John Henry Stewart (?)-1927 World War I

John Henry Stewart served as a Private and possibly Corporal in the Company C, 519th Service Battalion Engineers and the 15th Service Company, 20th Forestry Engineers during World War I. He was living in Saint Augustine, Florida, prior to his military service. Little is known about his postwar life, although he did live in New York at some point after the war. Stewart died in 1927 and is buried in the Saint Augustine National Cemetery.








"John Stewart." 1900 United States Federal Census.

Stewart, no. 82, was living in St. Augustine with his wife Carrie, daughter Rhena, and son Johnnie.










"John Stewart." Army Transport Passenger List.

(Stewart is listed as Corporal)








"John Stewart." Photograph of USS Northern Pacific.








"John Stewart." Army Transport Passenger List.
